In 1/3 of cases, endosalpingiosis is associated with endometriosis (Gynecol Oncol 2016;142:255) Endosalpingiosis was diagnosed in 7.6% of 1107 women undergoing laparoscopy in one study (J Am Assoc Gynecol Laparosc 2000;7:215)

Although both endometriosis and endosalpingiosis are speculated to derive from the secondary müllerian system 3, 4, the demographics and clinical presentation of these two diseases was found to be very different in the present study.

Endosalpingiosis can be a painful reproductive condition. It is similar to endometriosis, but instead of endometrial-like tissue as occurs in endometriosis, tissue from the fallopian tubes is found outside of the tubes and elsewhere in the pelvic cavity, and may cause pain, infertility, both, or neither.

Other reports that included associated benign conditions consisted of a single patient with endosalpingiosis 7, 8 or endometriosis. 16 Endosalpingiosis also was detected in 7 of 32 patients undergoing risk reduction surgery. 19 However, to our knowledge, the current study is the first to document the Mullerian nature of these benign structures in PWs, as documented by PAX8 immunoreactivity.

Conclusion (s): Endosalpingiosis appears to affect postmenopausal women at a rate much higher than previously reported.

What is endosalpingiosis?

Notes: Not associated with hemorrhage. In a lymph node, endosalpingiosis may be misinterpreted as a metastasis! DDx: Serous carcinoma. Peritoneal inclusion cyst. Adenocarcinoma.

Endosalpingiosis (ES) is the ectopic peritoneal presence of glands lined by tubal-type epithelium. It differs from endometriosis (EM) in that it has ciliated glandular epithelium, no endometrial stromal component, and does not exhibit an inflammatory response.

CONCLUSION: Endosalpingiosis is the second most common cause of peritoneal proliferation in the lower abdomen, with histologic evidence of the disorder in more than 7% of premenopausal women. In contrast to endometriosis, endosalpingiosis plays only a minor role in the evaluation of infertility and lower abdominal pain.

Endosalpingiosis in laparoscopy.

Endosalpingiosis is the presence of ectopic, cystic glands outside the fallopian tube that are lined with fallopian tube-type ciliated epithelium . Endosalpingiosis may occur in pelvic organs, including ovaries, fallopian tube serosa, uterine serosa, myometrium, or pelvic peritoneum.

Endosalpingiosis usually is an incidental microscopic finding, often occurring in association with ovarian serous neoplasms. It is generally not recognised by gynaecologists at the time of laparoscopic evaluation or is misdiagnosed as endometriosis. Macroscopically, this disease is usually not discernable.

Endosalpingiosis, an unrecognized condition: report and ...

Endosalpingiosis is diagnosed by a pathologist on excision (e.g. biopsy). It is characterized by cysts with tubal-type epithelium (e.g. ciliated epithelium) surrounded by a fibrous stroma. It is not often associated with hemorrhage. A tubal-type epithelium surrounded by endometrial-type stroma is a variant of endometriosis, not endosalpingiosis.
